The Central Coast Regional Development Corporation (CCRDC) has announced that John Taylor had stepped down as its chairman and thanked him for his achievements and ongoing support for the region.

“John chaired the board over the past three years, since the CCRDC’s transition from the Festival Development Corporation,” said acting CCRDC general manager Bob Hawes.

“Over this time, the scope and objectives of the corporation have broadened considerably.

Mr Taylor has also stepped down as a board member.

Mr Hawes said work was underway to name a replacement chair.
