The Central Coast Regional Development Corporation (CCRDC) is thrilled by the Commonwealth Government's announcement to build a new facility on a portion of the former Gosford Public School site on 20 Mann Street, Gosford. Moving Commonwealth employees to Gosford will boost investment and provide jobs in the region.
